A Message From The Pastor:

Building For The Storm

Having grown up here in the Piedmont – several hundred miles from the coast – I had always associated hurricanes with the damage from high winds. But toward the end of my Navy career, when we were living on the Gulf Coast at Pensacola, I learned the rest of the story. Most deaths, and damage, come not from high winds but from the storm surge. In the wake of Hurricane Georges, for example, damaged roofs and fallen trees were the least of our problem. Bridges were washed out, highways destroyed and even some parking lots collapsed. It wasn't just the force of the water, or the depth of the flooding, but the persistence of the water's action. It ate away at foundations once taken for granted until the structures they supported simply fell apart.

There's a lesson here more important than building codes and flood insurance. Our institutions and the quality of our life together are the result of stable foundations instilled by wise founders and entrusted to us. In recent years, some have decided that these foundations are old-fashioned and unimportant, that values are relative, and that there is no right or wrong. They argue that intangibles like patriotism, morality and faith are private matters which should never be allowed to intrude on our public policy. But long ago, the psalmist asked, *"If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?"* (Ps. 11:3). The prophet Isaiah warned, *"Therefore justice is far from us, nor does righteousness overtake us; we look for light, but there is darkness! ... Justice is turned back, and righteousness stands afar off, for truth is fallen in the street, and equity cannot enter"* (Isa. 59:5-10; 14-15).

Foundations are vital. In institutions and in our personal lives no less than in bridges and buildings... no matter how humble or impressive our accomplishments may be. And after seeing the storms around us, hopefully we will learn to build stronger foundations on higher ground. We need a faith that will not erode and let us down. As Isaiah prophesied, *"When the enemy comes in like a flood, the Spirit of the Lord will lift up a standard against him"* (Isa. 59:19).

One of the most famous of the 16th century Shogun rulers of Japan once compared the "able" person to an oyster in the Bay of Akashi. *"The Bay of Akashi,"* he explained, *"is one of the most stormy of all bays, so that fierce waves toss and toughen the oyster shells until it is known that the best shells come from the bay of violence. So in the world of humans,"* he said, *"the best people have been tried in the continual storms of adversity."*

Now is a good time to take a lesson and begin to strengthen the foundations around us. Then, when life's storms come to batter and test you, you will be prepared. Don't take that preparation for granted, and don't give up. God is in control, and he has promised never to leave you or abandon you.

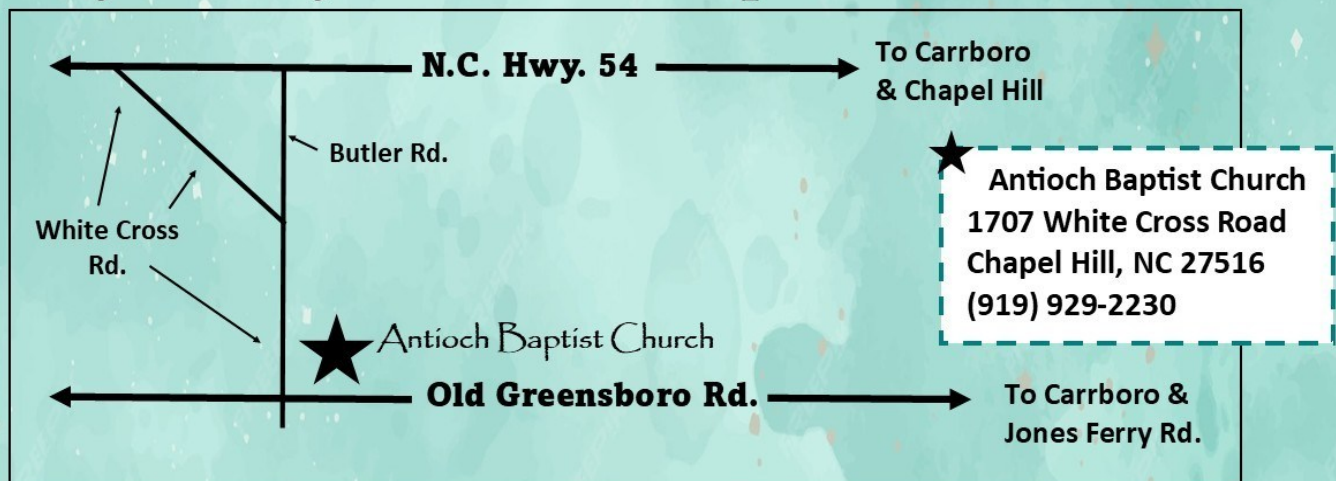

Brazil

In the early 1990s, the Mt. Zion Association and the Baptist Convention of Brazil organized a mission program covering five years of testimony and evangelism visitations.

Included are a couple of testimonials of one of the mission trips to Brazil from Antioch in 1991. In posting this, I was reminded of the importance of Christian service here in the community as well as working with other churches in sharing the gospel.

Memories of a Mission Trip to Brazil

August 1 - 14, 1991

August 1, 1991 began an adventure that has truly changed my life and has become one of the highlights of my life. Four people from Antioch, Ernie Keck, Pat Morris, Byron Tripp, and I left for Brazil to help do evangelism in the state of Sao Paula Brazil. I was stationed in Guaratingueta.

The people of the Baptist church and Pastor Walmir welcomed us with open arms. Neither race nor social status is a problem with the Brazilian church. Those of native Indian ancestry, African, Portuguese, Italian, German, and other people all worship together. They are so happy to know Jesus as personal savior and to invite others into their homes to get to know him.

I think that the most beautiful thing that I heard the entire time I was there was about twenty of the children singing "I Love You Lord" with no accompaniment. The believers of this small town really love the Lord and worship Him with their whole lives. They are so eager to share with others the news that Jesus is their personal savior.

Just this week, (May 2006) I have heard from three different people from the church. One of them is in full-time ministry translating the Bible into many languages and his main mission is to get the Bible into the prisons (especially the book of John that is called "The Freedom Book." They continue the ministry that was started before we even came. The church has grown to between 200 and 250 in attendance each Sunday.

The memories that I have of the love of those people and the hospitality and the way we became a family (because we do belong to the same family of God) will stay with me forever.

Pindamonhangaba is a city where 138,000 Brazilians live. It is located in the Paraíba Valley between Rio de Janeiro and Sao Paulo. This entire region is a fertile mission field and home of several churches of the Paraíba Valley Baptist Association.

In 1991, the churches of Mt. Zion Baptist Association developed a mission partnership with the churches in Paraíba Valley. I was invited by Pastor Ernie Keck of Antioch to prayerfully consider joining a team of short term mission volunteers that he was leading in this project. I accepted his invitation and made a commitment to serve in this unique opportunity of international missions.

By August, the team had attended orientation meetings and was prepared to travel on a series of plane flights about 4500 miles from North Carolina into South America. We were organized into pairs and given our ministry assignments. Mr. Pat Morris and I worked together during the two-week period of the trip. Pat was a sincere friend and faithful deacon at Antioch.

Pat and I were introduced to Pastor Abner in Sao Jose dos Campos. He was the minister of the Baptist Church in Pindamonhangaba and was working with two mission churches. Pastor Abner was a very dedicated and energetic man who loved God.

We knew the fun was just beginning when Pat and I realized Pastor Abner had brought three deacons with him to drive us to Pindamonhangaba in a compact station wagon. They didn't waste any time! We were loaded and headed up the interstate highway at a clip that seemed comparable to the take off speed of the jet plane we had been on the previous night. In just a few minutes we landed somewhere downtown in front of a small hotel.

Pastor Abner gave us a real tour of the ministry area. He would arrive at the hotel to get us each morning around 8:00 A.M. and usually we would return by 10:00 P.M. As he drove through the city, we were able to get a glimpse of the potential growth for new churches. It also seemed that he had arranged for us to meet every member of the congregation. Each family was so gracious to welcome us into their home and they all had food prepared! Every day was filled with discovering new friends who were eager to express their love for Christ with us. It was encouraging to see how God was working through the church. Many shared their testimony of receiving Christ as their Savior and how they were continuing to pray for family members that had rejected them. Pat and I experienced so many blessings because of their joy and enthusiasm.

I am eternally grateful for the prayers and financial support of Antioch that made this trip possible. It contributed significantly to my spiritual growth by giving me a deeper sense of purpose in serving Christ.

An Operation Christmas Child outreach event in a village known for its spiritual resistance brings a remarkable harvest of souls.

Ambodibibaka is so remote you can't even find it on most maps. The village is nestled in the forests of eastern Madagascar where its residents long held ancestral worship and traditions—until Samaritan's Purse teams recently brought the Gospel of Jesus Christ to children and their families. Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts opened the door and, today, classes of [The Greatest Journey](#) follow-up discipleship course have started with hopes of giving a new spiritual heritage to generations of Ambodibibaka residents!

Churches nearby had previously attempted to bring the Good News to Ambodibibaka but were threatened repeatedly. It appeared darkness had won. But God was not finished with Ambodibibaka! An Operation Christmas Child regional leadership team (RLT) in Madagascar's northeastern area of Analanjifofo felt called to bring shoebox gifts and the Gospel to hard places—places that had never heard of Jesus Christ and showed no interest in Him. In faith, the RLT, comprised of dedicated volunteers, began to pray, inviting churches to join them in their vision of reaching even Ambodibibaka with the Gospel.

But they, too, met resistance. "I don't want you to be disappointed, but nothing organized for Ambodibibaka has ever succeeded," said a deputy mayor. Another official added, "I can't authorize an event there. But if you're brave enough, go on your own." Undeterred, the team continued to press forward. Through prayer and persistence, the Operation Christmas Child volunteers reached out to the leaders of Ambodibibaka with a message of tangible love: "We want to bless your children. We want to give each child a gift."

Suddenly, the village leaders were interested! The parents also agreed to let the RLT come and volunteered to walk six hours to help carry the cartons of shoebox gifts to Ambodibibaka. Mothers and fathers who once rejected the Good News were carrying the very boxes considered "Gospel opportunities" in their own hands!

Next came the day no one thought could happen: our team hosted an Operation Christmas Child outreach event for more than 1,400 children. Interested parents and extended family members gathered around for the child-friendly festivities. For the first time, the village of Ambodibibaka heard the Gospel of Jesus Christ clearly presented!

Moved by this message of hope, child after child as well as numerous onlookers raised their hands indicating that they wanted to accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior! Roughly 1,500 residents of Ambodibibaka made that life-changing decision that day.

Boys and girls were then surprised as they received their very own Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts—brimming with fun, new items from overseas! Along with their own shoebox, each child was given a copy of [The Greatest Gift](#) booklet. This resource contains 11 Scripture stories that share the Gospel in a format they could return to again and again as well as share with others. Joy and celebration now radiate from Ambodibibaka!

Today, trained volunteers from nearby churches are leading our 12-lesson follow-up discipleship class, [The Greatest Journey](#), for shoebox recipients. Through dynamic Bible stories and an interactive student workbook, the children of Ambodibibaka are learning how to know, grow in, and share Jesus with friends and family. We praise God that a place that once said no to the Gospel has said yes to eternal salvation through Jesus Christ!

*“O LORD, God of our fathers, are you not God in heaven? You rule over all the kingdoms of the nations. In your hand are power and might, so that none is able to withstand you”
(2 Chronicles 20:6).*
